Mr. Kerr called for review of the Operations Report.

- The chopper pump for the Dempsey Lift Station lead time was 10-12 weeks, that
 would put it arriving sometime around the middle of next week. Unfortunately,
 we've now been told it will be sometime the 10th of August. This is a little behind
 schedule
- Lowered flow rate from the post equalization basin to the disinfectant contact chamber at TVWWTP to create more uniform flow and prevent stagnation in the DCC. Consistent flow prevents bacterial regrowth and low Ph levels because of extended and unnecessary detention time within the chamber. More consistent flow also allows for more measurable dosages of peracetic acid and lowers chemical costs.
- Completed Wastewater Laboratory Certification for the 2023-2024 period
- Set a new 2.5 Omnivore chopper pump in Quail Hollow LS. Pump was wired in to run automatically from existing floats in the station
- Routinely mowed and removed trash from all LS throughout the county
- Investigated Moore Branch sewer hookups utilizing existing maps. After investigating, two new customer accounts were found to be receiving sanitation services without being in the billing system. One connected septic tank at a vacant lot was also identified
- Pulled and cleaned floats in the Riverside LS to test functionality and ensure pump efficiency
- Replaced 4 E-One grinder pumps, completed 30 routine service orders, and pumped 6 septic tanks per customer request.
- Chris Ward and Ronnie Lowe attended an 8-hour training course covering wastewater treatment hosted by the University of Kentucky Water Institute
